

City Desk by Jeffrey T. Sherwin, Mayor Northlake History Video to Premier on October 25

A new 42-minute video, "A Journey Down Addison Creek" which tells the story of the City of Northlake, will premiere on Friday, October 25, 2024 at 7:00 p.m. at Northlake City Hall. A second show will be added at 8:00 p.m. should the first show be sold out. Tickets are free, but you must reserve them by calling City Hall at (708) 343-8700, or via our e-mail at northlakemayor@comcast.net.

The video traces the history of Northlake from its beginning through today by taking a journey down Addison Creek and its long lost 3 main tributaries.

After its "theatrical" release on October 25, where it will be shown in its entirety, the video will be streamed on the City's website starting in November in 6 chapters from November through April, 2025.

City Receives "Greentelligence" Award

The City of Northlake received the 2024 "Greentelligence Award" from the West Central Municipal Conference in recognition of the City's ongoing efforts in restoring the ecology of the City's portion of Addison Creek.

The award was presented to Mayor Jeffrey Sherwin at the WCMC's annual dinner on September 27. This is the 4th "Greentelligence Award" earned by the City of Northlake since May of 2010. The annual award is given in recognition of significant efforts in environmental and ecological improvement and is accompanied with a \$1,000.00 check, which will be used to augment the 2025 tree planting program.

The West Central Municipal Conference is an organization made up of over 36 west suburban communities, giving a unified voice to the entire area.





What To Do With Leaves

There are some procedures you need to remember regarding the leaves that fall at this time of year.

- -Do not rake the leaves to the curb or pile them in the parkway. They will wash into the storm drains.
- -Don't use plastic bags to collect the leaves.
- -Put them into paper bags or yard waste containers.
- -Put them out with the yard waste to be collected on Fridays.

Work Continues for Storm Water Management

City crews are finishing up on the dilapidated strip center on the corner of Wolf Road and Wiltse Drive to make way for a storm water management area next to Addison Creek. The City acquired this property through Cook County's "No Cash Bid" process after approximately \$1,000,000 in unpaid taxes and penalties had accrued. When completed next year, the area will be landscaped and configured to manage additional storm water run off.



Voter Registration On-Line

Election day is November 5, 2024. As is always true, this is a very important election. It is, first of all, for the president of the United States. There will also be other candidates and important referendums. Your vote does count. Voter registration on line ends October 20, 2024.

If you have not yet registered to vote, or recently changed your address, you can register on line. The Illinois State Board of Elections' on line voter registration application can be found at: https://ova.elections.il.gov/

- You must be a United States Citizen.
- You must turn 18 on or before the date of the General or Consolidated Election
- You must live in your election precinct at least 30 days prior to Election Day
- You must not be serving a sentence of confinement in any penal institution as a result of a conviction
- You may not claim the right to vote anywhere else.

After registering to vote, you can request an application to vote by mail in the November election. To do so, go to https://www.cookcountyclerk.com/agency/vote-mail. It only takes a few minutes to fill out the application.

Voting is your right and responsibility as a citizen. Please exercise it.

Prescription Drug Drop Off Box at Police Dept.

It may not be safe to dispose of medications by flushing them down the toilet or pouring them into the sink. It could be polluting the waterways in Illinois. The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District has seven water reclamation plants working to treat discarded water leaving the homes in the Chicago area. The process can remove many things, however, it is not designed to deal with prescription drugs. So they are returned to the waterways in Illinois.

Return unwanted or expired medication to a take-back program. This is the most environmentally safe way to dispose of these medications and will keep seniors, children and pets safe. The Northlake Police Department has a drop box located on the north end of the building. Drug drop off is anonymous and available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 

Snow Removal Application Form

The City of Northlake offers snow removal services to property owners who are over 65, disabled, handicapped and/or have severe health problems and have no one else who is able to help them with snow removal. Those interested in snow removal must re-apply every year. Deadline is November 9. No exceptions. Be sure to turn in your completed application before November 9, 2024. New applicants under 65 must submit medical verification from a doctor to City Hall in order to be eligible. Billing is \$15 per removal.

Remember: THE SNOW PLOW WILL MAKE ONE PASS ONLY ON YOUR DRIVE WAY. No sidewalks. No stairs.

I am 65 years of age or older and neither myself, a family member, a relative or a neighbor are able to plow my drive way. Include a copy of your drivers license or picture ID that has date of birth.

I am disabled and under 65. I will present a current medical verification from doctor or a Secretary License Disability Placard, or registration of disability through Social Security, along with a State of Illinois photo ID.

**Arrange for snow plowing bills from 2023/2024 to be paid in full so you can be added to the list for 2024/2025.

By submitting this documentation, I hereby voluntarily release protected health information to the City of Northlake that is otherwise protected by law, including but not limited to the Health insurance Probability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HEPPA).
